IMPORTANT TOPICS FOR THE NEXT MEETING TUES. 4/15/13 @ 5PM IN THE REC CENTER

The Board has been in touch with the association's attorney to amend the Pet Policy. In the last month the board has required owners to remove two dogs due to unacceptably aggressive behavior. This, coupled with some owners continuing to disregard over the last few years, despite courtesy warnings, association rules related to dogs, is an unacceptable trend the Board believes needs to be addressed.

Since 2011, the pet policy has stated that dogs over 40 pounds are not allowed in the community unless the Board expressly grants permission for the dog. We have published reminders of this rule many times.

If you have a dog that is over the weight limit:

- 1) If you have received written permission from the Board to have the dog over the 40 lb. weight limit that dog is grandfathered under the new rules.
- 2) If you have not received written permission for the dog, and if granted, must submit the attached registration form. Otherwise, the dog is not allowed to be in the community.

Please note the deadline in the rules for compliance with the registration requirement. Assuming the rules are adopted as planned at the 4/15 meeting, the deadline for registration is May 15th for the dog, you must first apply for and receive written permission.

If you are unsure whether you have been granted permission for a dog, it is your responsibility to confirm with the association.

Please note that certain breeds widely considered as having aggressive tendencies will be prohibited under the new rules from living in the Park at Quail Creek.

In addition to rule amendments, a bylaw amendment has been prepared. The amendment would:

- 1) Lower the number of Board members from 9 to 5. Nine, according to our HOA attorney, is very typical for a community of our size (196 homes), or any size for that matter. For example, Dell's Sun City in Georgetown has 5,000 homes with a Board of 5. I manage twelve other associations in addition to the Park; all but one requires five. None of my colleagues (22 other managers) have a 9 member Board stipulation, they too all have 3 or 5 member Boards. It can be difficult to reach quorum at board meetings when 5 out of 9 constitutes a quorum (3 out 5 will constitute a quorum).
- 2) Amend when the annual meeting is to be held. The bylaws currently require the annual meeting to be held the third Wednesday in July at 8pm. More will allow a time better suited to everyone's schedule.

General Remiders for Assocaition Living - the most common issues/violations

- Dog owners/handlers must keep dog(s) be on a leash at all times no matter the size, age, breed, "just running to the car" etc.
- Dog owners/handlers must clean up dog feces from the common area right away keep a baggie with you at all times. This helps preserve the area for your neighbors to walk freely throught the grass wih out stepping on something and protects animals from harmful parasites and the water shed.
- Dogs may not be stored in the patio area ever
- Trash cans must be stored out of sight except for Friday evening & Saturady returned to storage by Saturday night.
- Any items placed in the common area require ACC approval first.
- Satelittle dishes can NOT be mounted through the roof/shingles.
- Monthly assessmenst are due by the 1st with a grace period till 17th of each month; after this date there are fee's invloved, etc.

The swimming pool is now open! Please observe the pool rules for maximum safety & enjoyment.

Here are a few key rules to follow—the rest are listed at the pool and online.

Admittance is by key ONLY • Swim suits only – NO cut offs, shorts, etc. (all bad for the PH level of the pool) • Babies/children- Adults (18 and older) are required to be present with children under the age 14 at all times • Max number of guests per household is 4 • No glass bottles. Etc. • No pool parties • Babies that wear diapers/pull- ups (unless the are 'Little Swimmers' made for water) must be covered by plastic pants to prevent leakage & the fiber us material from breaking apart into the water (bad for the PH level, filter & motor) • No dogs in the pool (this throws the PH level off) When the PH level goes bad fungus and mold grow and then we have to shut the pool down for one to several days, depending on how bad, in order to chemically shock the pool – no fun and then no swimming!

Please be cognizant of the voices, if you have children of their voices, and the 'play' screaming; noise really carries around water and those who around the pool may be affected.
